MORNING SERMON OUTLINE ONE CATHOLIC & APOSTOLIC CHURCH Psalm 133 with other Scriptures

Next year this month will mark the 500th anniversary of the commonly held date for the beginning of the Protestant Reformation of the church – October 31, 1517, when Prof. Martin Luther posted his "Ninety Five Theses" on the door of the Wittenburg church calling for public discussion of practices he believed in the light of Scripture to be contrary to the Word of God and harmful to the people of God.

Central to the reform movement that followed was their love for the church of Jesus Christ – with no desire to divide it, but rather to see it freed from the encrustation of unscriptural doctrines and practices, and growing in faith and purity. We will spend time this month looking at the Bible's teaching about the church.
